TARGET GROUPS

Indigent men, women, Orphans and those displaced by war and natural disasters.

Objective: Combating domestic violence, child abuse, rape, women exploitation, sexual harassment, human trafficking and offering aid to those displaced by war and natural disasters; as well as - facilitating, promoting and / or setting up women's education and scholarships, empowering women, setting up a professional institute for women, caring for widows and orphans, and providing help for the less privileged and all other issues related to the poor and displaced people, in Nigeria, the Netherlands (and sometimes from other countries in Europe and Africa), as well as the performance of all further acts, which are related to this in the broadest sense or which may be conducive thereto.

POLICY PLAN

The foundation tries to achieve its goal by, among other things, organizing information forums to raise awareness about the rights of women in the society and the dangers of domestic violence and human trafficking. It has become the personal mission of the Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation to turn around the miserable situation of orphans, and poor widows in Nigeria – but also the poor and displaced persons in general – who have become victimized by injustice done to them. It is our goal to empower them with knowledge and to make them at cause again over their own lives. We plan to have a one-stop center where women can report and complain about rape, sexual harassment and human trafficking and where they can be informed about health and anti-conception. We will go to refugee camps to advise people and encourage them to be strong and independent. We intend to help men and women on their way to the application for admission to universities and to help them obtain scholarships. We welcome donations of food, clothing, medicines, money and computers and will work on the establishment of professional institutions to support the empowerment of women and to continue to give hope to the hopeless in the Society.

REVENUE

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation has been carrying out projects in Nigeria on self-sponsorship and donations from family and friends in Nigeria. There has not been any project done in the Netherlands. We have approached the municipality of Venray severally, but there have been no help/advice nor any collaborative efforts in helping the Foundation achieve its goals. We resorted to hosting African men and women, organizing advice sessions, and coffee times where women especially those who were trafficked, those who are victims of domestic violence, rape, sexual harassment and students finding it difficult to meet up with the financial requirements associated with their study. All these issues are addressed in our small meetings with the victims. In all the projects we have done since 2018, there has not been any support from the Dutch nor from the Nigerian Government. All items used during the empowerment programs were donated by Humanity First, Youths for Human Rights Amsterdam and the Mundo foundation. Most importantly, all the monies paid into the Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation ING bank account were contributions from the Board members. These monies are paid into the account to meet up with the tasks of running the Foundation pending when we are able to execute projects with support from donors and subsidies from the Dutch Government.

We also raise money through donations from private individuals and cooperate bodies and we plan to work with the government to initiate projects and programs to help the displaced people and the less privileged people, and to support in many other matters relating to the poor in Nigeria, the Netherlands, Africa, Europe and all over the World. The foundation has no profit motive.

REMUNERATION POLICY

The foundation's board and volunteers work selflessly and receive no compensation for their work. Expenses such as travel, accommodation, and conference fees are reimbursed when board members, volunteers, or speakers attend a conference or event relevant to promoting its mission, at the invitation of the foundation or an external organization and other miscellaneous expenses incurred in the course of carrying out a project or any other activities of the foundation.

The foundation raises funds from individuals and businesses to cover all expenses and costs for its campaigns and activities.

FUTURE GOALS

The Chevelyns Care Foundation is in need of 8 plots of land in Mgbowo to build a permanent site for Chevelyns Women Development Centre Mgbowo. This project is aimed at empowering Women in Mgbowo by building a Vocational Institute, where women can learn how to read and write as well as acquire different Technical/Vocational skills to be able to sustain themselves, take care of their children and contribute meaningfully to the Mgbowo Community. It will equally change their mindsets and help channel their energy into acquiring more training to be the best in their chosen fields.

The Centre when completed is intended to house:

- i. Technology Incubation Units for Women Entrepreneurs
- ii. Manufacturing Units with laboratory and hobs
- iii. Cassava processing plants
- iv. Palm oil processing plant
- v. Palm Kernel processing plants
- vi. Yam/plantain flour
- vii. Rice destoner Machine



1. Skill Acquisition Blocks:

- i. Fashion Designing
- ii. Hair dressing
- iii. Catering
- iv. Making of jewelries
- v. Soap making

2. Adult Education blocks:

- i. Class rooms
- ii. Library
- 3. Administrative Block
- 4. Multipurpose hall/event center.
- 5. Hostels
- 6. Business Centre
- 7. 50 KVA Generator and Solar panels

The idea is that the center should have constant power supply and be able to generate some revenue for its maintenance.

PROJECTS CARRIED OUT SO FAR BY STICHTING CHEVELYNS CARE FOUNDATION

PROJECT 2024

1.VISIT TO THE ST. MONICA ORPHANAGE LAGOS-December, 2024

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation Netherlands made a visitation to the St Monica Orphanage Lagos, on December 28, 2024. The caregivers were on hand to receive the gifts packaged for the orphans and donated by the Youths for Human Rights, Humanity First and the Mundo Foundation Netherlands.

2. SHARING OF CLOTHES /10 BAGS OF 50 KG RICE TO THE WIDOWS

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation celebrated the Christmas for the Widows in Enugu State Nigeria. The clothes donated by the Humanity First, Youths for Human Rights Amsterdam and the Mundo Foundation were distributed to the widows. Money and 10 bags of 50kg rice was also shared to them to enable them enjoy the festive season with their families.

PROJECT 2023

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation organized a 3-day workshop to educate the Widows on measures to take in the face of insecurity. Health awareness was highlighted at the workshop especially measures to be taken incase of rape, sexual harassment and other violent acts against women. Doctors were on the ground to carry out free medical tests on the Women.

PROJECT 2022

An information forum was organized by the Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation on the dangers of human trafficking. Flyers were distributed and 4-day awareness workshop organized to educate the women about illegal migration. Young ladies and men also participated in the workshop

PROJECT 2020

1.TRAINING PROGRAM (LEARNING HOW TO LEARN) IN ENUGU STATE USING STUDY TECHNOLOGY MODEL FROM THE APPLIED SCHOLASTICS INTERNATIONAL USA-2020.

Chevelyns Care Foundation just concluded her first training on Study Technology (Learning How to Learn) using Applied Scholastics model from the USA. The 3-day training program which took place at the temporary site of the Stichting Chevelyns Women Development Centre Mgbowo Enugu State, Nigeria had amongst its' participants, Secondary School Principals, teachers, the members of the Nigeria Police force, Vocational Skill trainers and other Civil Servants. Certificates from the Applied Scholastics USA were issued to the participants.

2. Launching of the Women Development Centre in Mgbowo, Awgu L.G.A Enugu State-Nigeria-2020.

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation on Saturday 11th January, 2020, took the first step towards building a Women Development Centre in Mgbowo, Awgu L.G.A Enugu State-Nigeria.

The event which took place at the temporary site, Chevelyns Close, Dam Road Ezioha Mgbowo was honoured by the traditional rulers of the two Mgbowo Autonomous Communities, HRH Engineer John Azubuike Ibe KSJI (Ohabuenyi ii of Ekpulambo), and HRH Igwe Gregory Ituma, KSJI (Onyima II of Ekpulato Mgbowo Autonomous Community). Also in attendance was the commissioner for gender, Enugu State, Mrs Peace Nnaji who promised a close collaboration between her Ministry and the Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation.

3. BE A MOTHER TO THE MOTHERLESS-2020.

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation Netherlands visited the St Monica Orphanage Lagos, on 13th December, 2020. Bags of Rice, clothes and toys were presented to the motherless children.

PROJECT 2019

1. SKILL ACQUISITION

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation-empowerment project took place on Thursday 24th, and Friday, 25th January, 2019 at the Temporal site of Chevelyns Care Foundation Women Vocational Institute, Dam Road, Ezioha Mgbowo in Awgu Local Government Area Enugu State. The program consisted of a 2-day workshop in which the women learned 2 skills:

- Soap Making
- Making Jewelry (with second-hand beads from NL)



Out of the 300 women who participated in the project, 200 were selected and empowered.

An intake was done with the women and the staff of first bank of Nigeria Garki Enugu branch was present to open a bank account for the women. This was an important moment for these women, because until that time, they had never had their own bank accounts.

This gave them the opportunity to start their own business with a micro-credit to support them in the commercialization of their home-made products.

The 2019 Women Empowerment Program, had in attendance some amazing speakers and experts from the Youths for Human Rights Netherlands who shared tips on the fundamental human rights. The women and youths also received lectures on identifying and pursuing opportunities to achieve desired goals.

2. Visit of Dutch Nationals to Nigeria-2019

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation-The Netherlands took some Dutch Nationals on a pilgrimage/Humanitarian tour to Nigeria.

Amongst the Interesting places visited was the Elele Pilgrimage Centre in Rivers State where they witnessed the special celebration of the presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Some indigent women were visited. Hospitals were not left behind as humanitarian work is the bedrock of the Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation.

PROJECT 2018

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

The Stichting Chevelyns Care Foundation-The Netherlands organized a one-day Seminar/Launching on Women Empowerment with the Theme: "Widows Sustainability and Transformation" aimed at ameliorating the suffering of widows by focusing on such other alternatives like skill acquisition that has the potential of empowering Widow for poverty alleviation and self-sustainability.

The event which took place on Friday, 9th March, 2018 at Hard Breaks Hotels, New Haven Enugu was aimed at empowering widows in Nigeria by building Vocational Institutes in all the states of the federation where Widows will learn different Technical/Vocational skills to be able to sustain themselves, take care of their children and contribute meaningfully to their community. The purpose is to create self-employment for the Widows as well as building a stronger economy, and achieving internationally agreed goals for development and sustainability. Chevelyns Care Foundation, at the event, shared a lot of gift items ranging from wrappers, bags of rice, cartoons of vegetable oil etc., to more than 150 Widows picked randomly from 10 out of the 17 Local Government Areas in Enugu State.
